### Seabird Tavern Caravan Park

## If Once You Have Slept on an Island by Rachel Field

If once you have slept on an island You'll never be quite the same; You may look as you looked the day before And go by the same old name, You may bustle about in street and shop You may sit at home and sew, But you'll see blue water and wheeling gulls Wherever your feet may go. Jam Drop Recipe

Simply combine 500g of butter and 1 cup of sugar until creamy (I use a wooden spoon). Add into butter mix 1, 395g tin of condensed milk and 5 cups of SR (Self Raising flour) and continue to mix until a smooth dough has formed. From here on you can do whatever you like with them.

Bake in a moderate oven until golden brown either soft or hard, depending on how you like them.

I suggest several additions to them eg: choc chips, raspberry jam, lemon curd or your favourite nuts.

This is an affordable, tasty recipe and makes approximately 100 biscuits for a minimal cost. They freeze well both cooked and as a raw dough. Enjoy!
